In the World

1876 – Alexander Graham Bell invents the **telephone**.

1879 – Thomas Edison invents the **electric light bulb**.

1883/11/18 – Standard Time implemented on all railways in North America. William Cornelius Van Horne, an American, but a Canadian resident is a major proponent.

1891/12 – Almonte native James Naismith invents basketball in Springfield, Massachusetts.

1896/04/06 – First modern **Olympics** are held in Athens, Greece.

1897 – Queen Victoria celebrates her **Diamond Jubilee**.

1899/10/11 to 1902/05/31 – **Boer War** is fought in South Africa.

In Canada

1879/11/06 – First **Thanksgiving Day** celebrated as a national holiday. It becomes the second Monday in October in 1957.

1885/03/26 to 1885/07/02 – Northwest Rebellion in Saskatchewan and Alberta.

1885/11/07 – Final spike driven for the completion of the Canadian Pacific Railway in Craigellachie, B.C.

1885/11/16 – Louis Riel is hanged for his involvement in the Northwest Rebellion.

1894/09/03 – The first **Labour Day** celebrated as a national holiday.

In Ottawa

1876/10 – **Library of Parliament** completed.

1885/05/01 – Ottawa becomes the first city in the world lit with **electric lights**.

1888/09/24 – First annual **Central Canada Exhibition** is held at Lansdowne Park.

1891/06/29 - Electric streetcar service inaugurated on Bank Street.

1892/03/18 – Lord Stanley, Governor-General of Canada, donates **Stanley Cup** as a hockey challenge cup.

1899/08 – Ottawa Improvement Commission established.

In Gloucester

1875 – First **Hurdman's Bridge** opens.

1882/09/30 – Canada Atlantic Railway opens. It runs through Gloucester from Hurdman's Bridge to Carlsbad Springs.

1883/05/01 – **Leitrim** Post Office opens. The community was previously known as Cowan's Settlement.

1885/02/20 – The Grey Nuns begin purchasing land in Orléans for their **Youville Farm**.

1885/04/15 – Leitrim native **David Latimer Cowan** dies at Fort Pitt during the **Northwest Rebellion**. He was a Northwest Mounted Police Officer.

1887/01/01 - New Edinburgh annexed into the City of Ottawa.

1892/07/07 – **Rideau Park**, formerly part of the Billings Estate, is subdivided as a market garden community.

1893/08/30 - Electric streetcar service extended into Gloucester at Rockcliffe.

1898/07/29 – Ottawa and New York Railway opens, running across

Gloucester from Hurdman's Bridge to Edwards.

1898/08/29 - Rockcliffe Rifle Range opens, north end of St. Laurent Blvd.

1898/09/05 – Canadian Pacific Railway M&O Subdivision opens, running across Gloucester from Hurdman's Bridge to Blackburn.
